# IMP = TODAY!

# MIXED TEAMS = SUNDAY

#### 3 p.m. sharp!

Mixed team is a team of 4-6 players (minimum 2 men and minimum 2 women). Every pair at the table for each round should consist of one women (sitting East or South) and one man (guess – sitting North or West).

We are going to play 6 rounds, 8 boards per round. First 3 rounds Swiss movement, second 3 rounds Danish movement.

#### Orientation time table:

1st round: 15:00-16:05 2nd round: 16:20-17:25 3rd round: 17:40-18:45

(dinner break)

4th round: 21:00-22:05 5th round: 22:20-23:25 6th round: 23:40-00:45

A team may introduce a substitute, a pair or player, after half of the match, but only in the open room.

A team may not enter later then 18:45, first bye (unplayed round) will be awarded 4VP (-7imps), and every additional unplayed round 5VP (-3imps). I have to mention that it would be at least strange to choose to join at the end of the 3rd round and that you need to have the chief's (Brk) permission to do so, but it is possible.

We shall score with Bridgemates again. So if your result matches the one on the big screen you should do nothing, but if it doesn't you should go to the computing desk and they will solve the problem.

If you have any problem in finding a team or pair we have organized a partnership desk (next to the registration desk). There are some nice staff members who will help you to find a perfect partner or a team to play with.

# **New Laws**

(Adopted from from European Championship 2008 Bulletin, Pau, No 2, and The English Bridge Union website)

In Shanghai October 2007 the WBF adopted new laws. In most European countries these new laws will be implemented in August/September this year. For lot of the players this festival is the first opportunity to play with the new laws, which makes it important to pay some attention to the changes.

The dummy has to put his cards on the table in columns lengthwise and in descending order towards declarer. No alternative is allowed.

Players should put their played cards in a won or lost position in an orderly row. When a player puts such card in the wrong position his partner is allowed to notify him until the lead is made to the next trick. When this is done too late it creates unauthorized information which might result in an adjusted score.

Defenders may ask each other about a possible revoke in the current trick. Dummy cannot ask a defender whether he has revoked. However he can still ask declarer. Defenders are allowed to ask one another whether they have revoked. So when one defender asks the other 'having no spades, partner?' there are two possible answers. No, I don't or Yes, I do. If the answer is 'no', then play carries on. If the answer is 'yes' the TD will need to be summoned. The TD will rule that the card played in error becomes a major penalty card and left face up on the table; the offender substitutes a legal card in place of the revoke card. Cards played after the attempt to revoke may be changed. The major penalty card is then subject to the usual rule.

Only unintended calls may be changed up till the next call from partner. A call made as a result of a slip of the mind may not be changed anymore.

All players are entitled to try to prevent an irregularity made by one of the other players. Up till now only the dummy had that right and only towards his own partner/declarer.

A pair that has agreed with a claim made by one of its opponents and later discovers that it likely would have won an extra trick will be awarded that trick (within the given protest time).

A defender should not make a claim when the success of it depends on his partner's cooperation in playing a specific card from alternative (normal) choices. If play continues after a claim (which is not allowed in the laws), evidence appearing in that continuation may be used by the TD to decide the result on the board.

When adjusting a score the TD strives for equitable results, which often will be accomplished by assigning a weighted score, taking into account the probabilities of several reasonable outcomes. This is already common procedure in championships but is now described in detail in the laws.

Sometimes players ask questions because they do not think their partner has understood. It is illegal to do so.

You are still required to agree a hesitation, for example, when it happens and the TD should be summoned if there is any disagreement. The new laws state that the best time to claim actual damage is at the end of the hand (e.g. rather than on sight of dummy).

You are now allowed to ask about the meaning of an individual call in the opponents' auction. But it shouldn't be done in such a way as to suggest a call or play to partner such as "does that 2H bid show hearts?" – perhaps indicating that the questioner holds hearts. There is a short period between the final pass and the first card being faced, when questions are asked. This is now called the Clarification Period. Members of the declaring side may consult their own system cards during this time to make sure nothing has been misexplained, for example.

For any additional information you may need about these laws or special rules of the festival (see the last page) please contact any of our TD-s.

#### SPECIAL CONTEST

Me, myself and I (Tihana) am looking for a partner for mixed pairs. All (if any) interested should come to the Press room on Sunday or Monday (during the break between sessions or after the tournament). Special committee (Kobas and SchTsch) will talk to you decide between (if any) candidates.

# Learn more about Pula...

What do you know about the city of Pula... yes, sure, it is the venue of the one of the most beautiful bridge festival... but... did you know...

Pula is also the host of one of the oldest film festivals in Europe. Pula Film Festival was first inaugurated as an international film festival in 1953. on the initiative of Mr. Marijan Rotar. It was the main film event in Yugoslavia from 1954. to its disintegration. Numerous journalists and film artists from the country and abroad including stars like Orson Welles, Sophia Loren, Sam Peckinpah, Richard Burton, Elizabeth Taylor, Yul Brinner and others visited the Festival.

From 1992. Pula hosted the Croatian film festival and 2001. it again acquired the status of an international festival with awards for best foreign films. Many Croatian award winners from the Pula Film Festival were very successful at foreign festivals: Tu, Maršal, Svjedoci, Ta divna splitska noć, Fine mrtve djevojke, Put lubenica... During the last fifteen years the Festival has attracted many foreign visitors among whom the stars like John Malkovich, Ralph Fiennes, Ben Kinglsey, Jeremy Irons, producer Branko Lustig and directors Philip Noyce and Jiri Menzel.

Vespasian's Arena, which has been hosting the festival since its beginnings, has given it the status of one of the three biggest and most spectacular open-air festivals in Europe. It can seats up to 8000 visitors at the screenings under the starry sky.

Zlatna Arena (The Golden Arena, work of Dimitrije Popović) is traditionally awarded at the festival. A number of other official awards are granted at the Festival.

# BRIDGE – the new age religion

I had a dream.

I dreamt that a diamond crusade had ended in a no trump slaughter.

I dreamt that a club jack had sacrificed a queen of hearts to the 150 honor trump suit.

I dreamt that a white smoke had emerged from the deck when a trump suit had been elected.

And, finally, I realized that bridge must be a religion, otherwise my dreams wouldn't make much sense. And they do, believe me.

So, one of the definitions is that religion is a set of beliefs, values and practices based on the teaching of a spiritual leader with belief in and reverence for a supernatural power of powers. Using the given definition one cannot but notice that bridge is not just a religion, it is a set of religions worshipping the same god but in different fashion.

The god is, of course, the point, either IMP or MP. There are some factions that worship even TP, but as total points are not recognised by the olympic bridge religious community it is considered a heresy, so the holy trinity of bridge is inconsistent and therefore inexistent. Considering the fact that there are two instances of the bridge god, the human nature makes the conflict between followers of the single instance imminent. IMP worshippers will accuse MP that it is not bridge at all. MP worshippers will accuse IMP that it is not fun at all. But, as an outer enemy always makes the community more homogeneous, so is this IMP-MP antagonism in fact a constructive pacemaker for development of both instances, and therefore the bridge in general so it is considered a holy dunity of the bridge god.

Bridge religion consists of two main sets of beliefs, natural and scientific. The natural set of beliefs is the oldest orthodox approach of preserving the traditional methods. It is based on the doctrine "The means justify the end", and no matter how catastrophic the end might be it is justified if no artifical means have been used. There is a cathartic experience in going down in 3NT because you couldn't use the fourth suit forcing to find a stopper in the suit. On the other hand, the scientific set of beliefs is based on the doctrine "The end justifies the means" and it is quite common

for every scientific bidder in a situation where it is certain that the final contract will be 4\(\Delta\) to use another four relays, one strength asking and one last train cue before passing partner's 4\(\Delta\) response.

Bridge religion also consists of two main sets of values, mathematical and artistic. Mathematicians use numbers to explain everything. They will know that it is a 31.5% game and won't bid it because the expectation value is not positive. They will also know that finesse has 3.65% better chances than a squeeze and play the finesse despite the crowd of kibitzers cheering for the squeeze. The real mathemetician knows not only that the chance of winning the match after the first quarter is 16.87%, but also that there is a 43.2% chance that partner will bluff on the board 11 and that there is a 87.4% chance that he will go to the toilet before the board 9. Artists, on the other hand, do not use numbers. It kills the art. Artists don't use blackwood. It's for sissies. There is not much fun in making a slam with only one keycard missing. Every good artist knows that the club king is always singleton just as every good artist knows that major suit queen lies in front of the jack and minor suit one lies behind the jack. The last but not the least, every good artist knows when to drop doubleton gueen behind AKJ in 3-3 fit or play a backward finesse, both with no extra information. Who needs numbers for that, anyway?

The division according to beliefs and values is rather independent. Although it is quite common for mathematicians to use the scientific approach and make that vital distinction between 56.2% and 56.6% game as it is common for artists to use the natural approach in their extravagant creations, it is not a rule. Mathematicians normally use the natural approach just as artists normally use the scientific approach. It's more fun, they say. So division according to beliefs and values is not a base for religious factions in bridge. It is an abstract definition of orthodox movements in bridge that don't exist in practice. Well, not guite as the traditional match "Scientists vs Naturalists" was revived by Dimitri Marchessini last year, but one flower does not bring spring and these orthodox movements are just mere elements of the modern bridge fractions. In practice, religious factions in bridge are defined by practices.

We have four main religious factions in bridge:

- 1. Acol
- 2. Preparatory club
- 3. Strona club
- 4. Polish club

All these factions and religious wars between them will be described in detail in the following articles. If there will be any.

- ♠ 1 NT opening bid, if not 15-18 balanced variety must be alerted!
- 1NT opening bid less then 10 Hcp is not allowed.
- **▲ 1NT opening bid tolerates singleton A/K.**
- ♠ 1NT opening with small singleton (Q or lower) is not allowed unless it is part of the system in which case it should be alerted.
- ♠ HUM and brown stickers are not allowed (please check with TD if you are not sure about conventions you use).
- ♠ Do not alert after 3NT!
- ♠ Psychics in strong openings are not allowed!

**How well we are doing?** Here is the scheme of number of units in every tournament since year 2000. We are very satisfied with this numbers and we hope to repeat them this year.
