Entering Events

For every event a pair or a team has to enroll at least one hour before the play starts. In the next half hour registration is still possible but with double entry fee.

For every event you may enroll at any time when the Enrolment desk is open, so please do it in advance!

Entries for all events can be paid in Kunas or Euros but we suggest paying in Euros, because our exchange rate is not so favorable. For pair events entry fees will be paid at the table, by putting the money in the envelope provided; for teams events entry fees are paid at the time of registration. Please prepare exact amount of money to avoid delays.

Delays & leaving the playing area

Always come to the playing room on time! Try to avoid delays and slow play, as those who are repeatedly late will be penalized. During all tournaments remain seated until the round is over. Please don't leave the playing area in order to smoke.

Alert procedures

The Alert procedure is as follows:

- 1NT opening bid, if not 15 18 balanced variety must be alerted;
- strong two-s & any "multi" opening bids must be alerted;
- weak two-s (6-10 Hcp & 6 cards in bidden suit) shouldn't be alerted;
- most players in Croatia play 1♣ opening as 2+ cards in clubs (only two clubs are possible when 4-

- 4-3-2). Because it is so common in Croatia, it shouldn't be alerted. All other opening bids that don't guarantee at least 4 cards in bidden suit must be alerted;
- one in major shouldn't be alerted if it shows 4 or 5 cards, however if you play canapé, it should be alerted;
- jump bids that are not invitational should be alerted (1&-pass-3& - if this is preempt or game force should be alerted);
- all negative doubles must be alerted;
- 4th suit forcing should be alerted;
- if screens are not used, do not ALERT after 3 NT.

Other

- Use the STOP card always or never! (same as your partner)
- Make your opening leads face down.

Bidding Rules

- Highly artificial systems and "Brown Sticker" conventions are not allowed in any part of the tourney! Please contact TD for additional information if needed.
- RULE 18 (the sum of cards in two longest suits and the number of HCP must be at least 18 to open the hand) is applied in all pair games in first and second seat only! Strong opening bids may not be psyched in any MP or IMP games, and 1NT is considered as a strong opening bid.
- 1NT opening bid is allowed with singleton only if it is A or K. 1 HCP tolerance is allowed.

I am absolutely thrilled when I am starting with this article. This article means that Pula is near. I am almost there. We shall meet again, we shall play some bridge and have wonderful time. For me it is really feeling which makes my soul sing and fly (trust me you wouldn't like me to sing in public so lets keep it in my soul. No one deserves that kind of punishment.).

Lets skip romantic and bad humor and start with relevant information and rules which will be part of our life in the next 10 days.

Near left entrance of the hotel Histria we have installed registration desk. Purpose of the registration desk is TO REGISTER (sounds unbelievable I know). So please do it - REGISTER. Registration is essential for us to start or even to hold a tournament. Here are a lot of us called 'staff' – more or less important, with our different roles, but with one common target - we are here at your disposal and we will try to make this Festival pleasant. Do not hesitate to come and ask for assistance for anything which you might need help for.



IMP = TODAY!

So today we shall start (on time) with imp pair tournament – Butler. It starts at 9 pm. That means

you should and will register until 8.30 at the latest (thank you). Entry fee will be paid at the table.

We will play 13-15 rounds, 2 hands per round and score the results with Bridgemates.

Smoking and leaving the playing area during the tournament is strictly forbidden and disobeying this rule can cost you a serious number of match points. Don't forget to fill in a convention card. You can find your copy at the Partnership desk. I think this will be all for the moment, I just have to introduce the last year's winners to you:

MIXED TEAMS = SUNDAY 3 p.m. sharp!

Mixed team is a team of 4-6 players (minimum 2 men and minimum 2 women). Every pair at the table for each round should consist of one women (sitting East or South) and one man (guess – sitting North or West).

We are going to play 6 rounds, 8 boards per round. First 3 rounds Swiss movement, second 3 rounds Danish movement.

Orientation time table:

Morning session:

1st round: 15:00-16:05 2nd round: 16:20-17:25 3rd round: 17:40-18:45

(dinner break)

Evening session:

4th round: 21:00-22:05 5th round: 22:20-23:25 6th round: 23:40-00:45

A team may introduce a substitute, a pair or player, after half of the match, but only in the open room. A team may not enter later then 18:45, first bye (unplayed round) will be awarded 4VP (-7imps), and every additional unplayed round 5VP (-3imps). I have to mention that it would be at least strange to choose to join at the end of the 3rd round and that you need to have the chief's (Brk) permission to do

so, but it is possible. We shall score with Bridgemates again. So if your result matches the one on the big screen you should do nothing, but if it doesn't you should go to the computing desk and they will solve the problem.

If you have any problem in finding a team or pair we have organized a partnership desk (next to the registration desk). There are some nice staff members who will help you to find a perfect partner or a team to play with.

SPAM

While skating on cheap skates, I'm continuously thinking how to improve our bidding. In moments of inspiration, I see how to improve some sequences which might seem unimprovable.

Let's have a look to this everyday bidding problem. Playing sort of Standard American system, you pick up:

●KJx

♥Kxxx

◆KJx

LKJ

You count your points and open 1 NT. Partner responds 3 NT. You start to concentrate to make best of this game contract. Suddenly you discover that ace of diamonds was hiding under king. You are proud to see that your hand has improved significantly! So, you're real hand turns out to be:

≜KJx

♥Kxxx
♠AKJx

u KJ

What do you do now? You pass? Or bid 6NT? Obviously it's a guess. But with good bidding system, you could get your partner involved in assessing new situation. It's time to introduce you to **SPAM** convention! Spam stands for 'Sorry Pard, Again Miscounted'. It applies to all standard sign-of sequences, when you are normally expected to pass. Here is it how it works. Basic situation is:

You-bid - partner-bids-signoff in same denomination - ?

Most common continuation now should be a pass. Meaning of pass is: "Everything OK pard, I do have a hand that I have bid in 1st round". To be on safe side, you should alert this pass, especially if you are playing with partner that miscount frequently. Opponents are entitled to know that with this pass, partner has acknowledged his first bid was at least plausible!

But, if you have miscounted to level of full playing trick, say ace or king, you could conventionally bid one more in your denomination! In our previous example, bidding should go: 1 NT - 3 NT-4NT*(SPAM). Partner duly alerts and, if asked for explanation, states: 'Partner is spamming for around one additional playing trick". He is also reasonably well placed to make his further move. In our previous example, if partner has mediocre 10-count, he will pass. With bit more he could invite, or bid slam. In fact, he gets for free one more chance to rectify a count of his own hand, thus further improving preciseness of partnership bidding! Please don't confuse this technique with 'rectifying a count' in squeeze terminology. Form of rectification we are talking about in this example is coming far more frequently!

So far, so good. But, if you could miscount your points, you certainly could mess-up your distribution, aren't you? Not to worry, again SPAM is here for rescue. Let's see how it works in this by know classical example; $1\ NT-3\ NT!$ Let's suppose that you have initially mixed two small hearts into diamonds. Your real hand might be something similar to:

●Kx

♥KJTxxx

Ax

■KJx

Playing SPAM, you still have possibility to steer partnership to possibly better game, 4 hearts. Just bid it! Partner will probably know what to do, and, to be on safe side, it's anyway unlikely that he is carrying a gun to bridge session.

To make situation more complex, we will take into account one of worst possible situations you can find yourself in bidding. Back to our '1NT-3NT-?' example. First free bidding step, in this case 4 clubs, is having special artificial meaning. Basically, it states: I forgot our system and my previous bid does not have any resemblance with my real hand. Based on that useful information, partner is encouraged to use his imagination. He should reason on following lines: "What confused this moron on other side this time? Maybe he thought that 1 NT was unusual in this sequence, showing both minors? AHA! ...and he places final contract accordingly!

Interesting Facts about Croatia

Did you know...

- That the Dalmatian dog from the film "101 Dalmatians" was named after Dalmatia, in which most of the Croatian Adriatic is located.
- That the first public theatre in Europe was opened in 1612 on the island of Hvar, in the town which "Conde Nast Traveler Magazine" entered at the fifth place on its Top Ten list of best island towns in the world.
- That by the end of the third century AD, the Roman emperor Diocletian decided for construction of his palace the place where the city of Split is located today. The Palace of Diocletian is one of the best known integral architectural and cultural constructions in the world, which, due to its preservation and beauty, UNESCO entered in its registry of World Cultural Heritage in 1979.
- That in the small town of Trogir, 30 km away from Split, founded in 3rd century BC, there is one of the best preserved Romanesque-Gothic complexes in the world. Trogir is an excellent example of a medieval town built on and conforming with the layout of a Hellenistic and Roman city and it is therefore also on the World Cultural Heritage list of UNESCO.
- That, before Newton's discovery, the town of Dubrovnik, which has been on the World Cultural Heritage list of UNESCO since 1979, owned a telescope which was constructed by Marin Getaldic (1568-1626), the greatest Croatian scientist of that time.
- That the necktie has its origin in Croatia (in Croatian: Kravata, English: Cravat, French: Cravate, German: Krawatte, Italian: Cravatta, Spanish: Corvatta) and that the word "cravat" came from the word "Croat" (Hrvat in Croatian); so called because worn by Croats in the French army during the Thirty Years' War. In their own way, with the cravat, the Croats have started conquering the world from the coasts of the Adriatic Sea from 17th century. The consequences of that conquering are today felt around the necks by 600 million businessmen worldwide.
- That Marco Polo (1254-1324), an adventurer, merchant and one of the best known world travelers, whose book "The Travels of Marco Polo" is the first tourist book in the world, comes from Korcula on Korcula island in Croatia.

- That in 1458 Benko Kotruljevic from Dubrovnik wrote one of the first books on world economic literature, "On Trading and the Perfect Merchant", and that he was the first to establish the basis of modern double-entry book-keeping.
- That Shakespeare's Twelfth Night was staged in Dalmatia.
- That the writer Vladimir Nabokov always spent his summers in Opatija as a boy.
- That Agatha Christie spent her second honeymoon in Dubrovnik and Split.
- That James Joyce was a teacher of English in Pula from 1904 and 1905, in the town that has existed for three millennia with one of the best preserved Roman amphitheatres worldwide.
- That the Duke of Windsor and Wallis Simpson spent their vacations in Dalmatia.
- That Luka's pit ("Lukina jama"), the tenth by depth in the world (1392 m), is located in Croatia on Velebit Mountain.
- That the founder of San Marino, a small independent republic in the northeast of Italy, was the sculptor Marin from the village Lopar from the island of Rab.
- That the ball-point pen was invented by a Croat, Eduard (Slavoljub) Penkala (1871-1922), that it bears his name and is in daily use.
- That the names of two Croats are on the map of the Moon names of scientists J. R. Boskovic and A. Mohorovicic.
- That two winners of the Nobel Prize in chemistry came from Croatia Lavoslav Ruzicka (1939) and Vladimir Prelog (1975).
- That Nikola Tesla (1856-1943), the father of alternative current electricity and technology of wireless communications, after which the unit for magnetic induction is named, was born in Croatia, and that he refused to receive the Nobel prize he had to share with T. A. Edison.

FESTIVAL RULES

- ♠ Always be on time!
- ♠ Make your registration in advance!
- ♣For both pair and team games you should register at the Registration desk at least one hour before tournament starts, but please do it as soon as possible.
- ♠ Open pairs MP is limited to 350 pairs, so make your registration TODAY!
- ♠ For teams tournaments you should pay your entry fee at the Registration desk at the time of registration
- ♣ For pairs tournaments you should pay entry at the table in the first round (please prepare exact amount of money in advance). In case you do not put exact amount of money in the envelope we will return the change next day at the Registration desk.
- **♠** Slow play will not be tolerated
- ♠ Remain seated until the change is announced!
- ♠ Bridge mates will be used at all events except open pairs.
- ♠ The use of the stop card is obligatory!

- ♠ The convention card is obligatory! Please fill free to take a copy at the Registration desk.
- ♠ Make your opening leads faced down!
- **♠** Leave the boards, the bidding boxes and the score sheets on the table.
- ♠ Be nice to your partner, opponents, officials of the tournament and others...only together we can make this tournament friendly and convenient place for all.
- **♠** Follow the ALERT procedure!
- **♠** 1 NT opening bid, if not 15-18 balanced variety must be alerted!
- ♠ 1NT opening bid less then 10 Hcp is not allowed.
- **♠ 1NT opening bid tolerates singleton A/K.**
- ♠ 1NT opening with small singleton (Q or lower) is not allowed unless it is part of the system in which case it should be alerted.
- **♠** HUM and brown stickers are not allowed (please check with TD if you are not sure about conventions you use).
- ♠ Do not alert after 3NT!
- ♠ Psychics in strong openings are not allowed!

Here is the scheme of number of units in every tournament since year 2000. We are very satisfied with this numbers and we hope to repeat them this year.
